GENERAL INFORMATION AND SCORING POLICIES

This is a 2-day omnium (3-day for Junior Cup Race) race based on points. The winner from each category will have the most points based on the following scale. Ties in General Classification shall be broken based on the highest place in the last stage ridden.

REGISTRATION

Online registration is at <https://www.bikereg.com/laprimaveratx>. Field sizes are limited to 125 riders, inclusive of combined races on course (75 for All Novice categories).

- NO REFUNDS ALLOWED ONCE REGISTRATION CLOSES
- NO rider substitutions or replacements are allowed.
- Riders must register for the category listed on their USA Cycling license. Riders will not be allowed to change their category at the race.
- Riders must have a current USA Cycling license.
- ONLY Men Novice, Women Novice & Masters Novice are eligible for one-day beginner licenses.

FOREIGN RIDERS

All foreign riders at the 2025 La Primavera Lago Vista will need an international race license that is in good standing with their national Federation and a Foreign Permission Letter from their national Federation that permits the rider to race in the United States during the dates March 1-2, 2025 (February 28-March 2 for Juniors). The letter must also specify one of the following:

- The rider is covered by medical insurance for racing in the United States.
- The rider is not covered by medical insurance for racing in the United States and will provide proof of such coverage.
- The rider accepts full responsibility for all medical costs they incur at the event.

If no Foreign Permission Letter is provided, the rider understands and agrees that they shall solely be responsible for any medical costs and/or claims and for purchase of any medical insurance desired that will cover them while participating in La Primavera Lago Vista.

NUMBER PICKUP

Time Trial - Friday 2/28/2025 starting at 9:00am at Time Trial located at the Driveway Race Track, 8400 Delwau Lane, Austin, TX 78725. All Juniors racing the Time Trial will be required to sign an additional USA Cycling waiver for use of the Driveway Track.

Registration and number pick up for the Road Races will open at 6:30am and will close 30 minutes before the start of each race. Registration is located at 1925 American Way, Lago Vista, TX 78645.

SAFESPORT

La Primavera Lago Vista is a USA Cycling sanctioned event and aligns with USAC in that athlete safety and well-being is of the utmost importance. To help create and foster a safe environment that is free from misconduct and abuse at all USA Cycling events, everyone should review USA Cycling's Safe Sport Program Policies, including reporting requirements and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP). All Participants at USA Cycling sanctioned events must abide by these policies.

PROHIBITED CONDUCT

All Participants at this event are expected to refrain from engaging in Prohibited Conduct as defined by the US Center for SafeSport Code. Prohibited Conduct includes but is not limited to the following: sexual misconduct, emotional misconduct, physical misconduct, bullying, harassment, hazing, and violations of the MAAPP.

MAAPP

These policies have been adopted by USA Cycling to establish clear boundaries between participants in cycling and to reduce isolated one-on-one interactions between minors and adults in cycling and apply during all USA Cycling events, including before, during and returning from the event: One-on-One Interactions; Meeting & Training Sessions; Athletic Training Modalities; Locker Rooms; Transportation; Lodging; Electronic Communications.
Reporting Requirements

Adult Participants are required to report violations of USA Cycling's Safe Sport Program, including violations of the MAAPP. The mandatory reporting requirements apply to Adult Participants, but USA Cycling encourages anyone who becomes aware of or experiences misconduct or abuse to report those allegations via the links provided below.

PROTESTS

- Time Trial: Protests for the TT must be made to the Chief Judge within 15 minutes of posting.
- Road Race: Protests for the RR must be made to the Chief Judge within 15 minutes of posting.

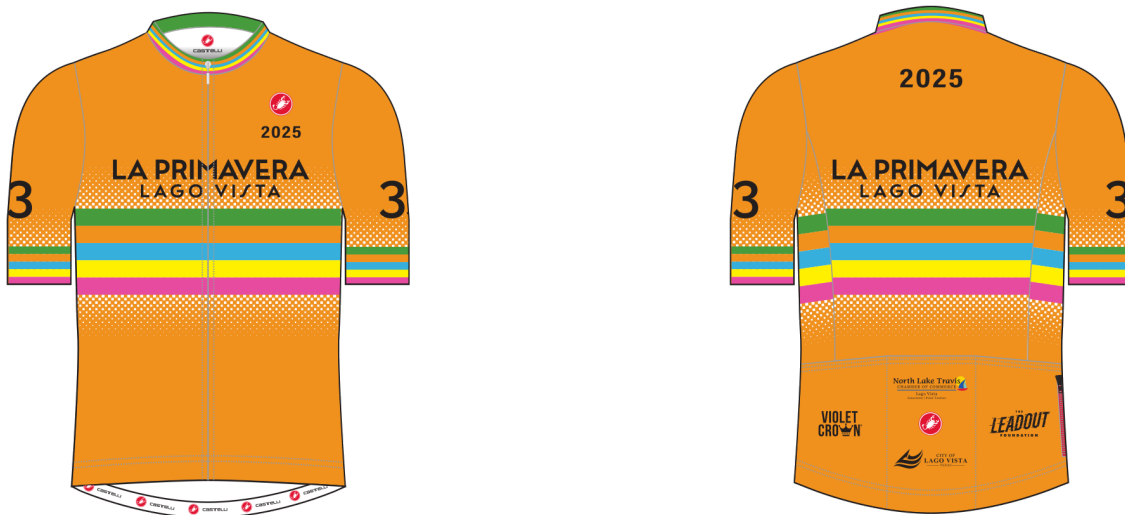

CENTERLINE

All roads are open to traffic. Obey and respect all police officer, official, and staff requests. **If you cross the centerline, you will be disqualified.** If no painted centerline marking exists, riders must keep to the right side of the road at all times. The finish line will be open to full road use 400 meters to the finish.

CASTELLI LEADER'S JERSEY



The GC leader for every category must wear the Castelli Leader's Jersey for each stage.

- Time Trial GC leaders will pick up their jerseys at the Time Trial Awards Ceremony.
- Road Race GC leaders will pick up their jerseys at the Awards Ceremony.

If your category has multiple lead changes, you may be asked to return a clean Leader's Jersey

prior to the start of the next stage. Failure to wear the Leader's jersey will result in a ten point penalty in omnium classification.

RACE NUMBERS

Each rider will be given two (2) bib numbers. No frame number. A side number should be placed along the side seam of the jersey and the second number should be placed on or above the jersey pocket. See images below. All riders **MUST WEAR BOTH** bib numbers for all races. If you do not wear both bib numbers, you will be assessed a points penalty!

DO NOT CUT, FOLD or ALTER NUMBERS. Riders altering numbers are subject to a fine and points penalty.

JUNIOR CUP AND NATIONAL TEAM SELECTION EVENT

Returning for 2025, La Primavera at Lago Vista has been designated as part of the USA Juniors Cup and as a USA Cycling National Team Selection event.

USA Cycling is thrilled to announce the return of the USA Juniors Cup for 2025, continuing the partnership to deliver a premier national development race series. The mission remains the same: a reliable calendar with a competitive format where USA Cycling can identify young talent.

Building on the success of previous years, the 2025 series will feature eight events, three of which have been designated as National Team Selection Events. Similar to this past season, the top performers at Valley of the Sun (Arizona), La Primavera (Texas), and Tour of America's Dairyland (Wisconsin) will earn invitations to National Team trips and camps.

The overall general classification winners of each selection event for the Junior 17-18 Men's and Women's categories 1/2/3/4 will receive automatic nominations for a 2025 National Team trip, partially funded by the USA Juniors Cup. Additionally, the top-placed 15-16 male and female riders category 1/2/3/4 at each selection race will be invited to attend a USA Cycling European race camp.

LOCATION

The Time Trial is located at the old Driveway Austin Motorsports Race Track, 8400 Delwau Lane, Austin, TX 78725

PARKING

Located at the track in designated areas.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This is the first stage of the Junior Cup Omnium; only Juniors registered for the race will be allowed on the track. The course is a 10km TT, riding clockwise on the track. Riders will complete ~3.75 laps of the track, with the 4th time across the finish line stopping the clock. Riders are responsible for following the course and distance to finish.

WARM UP

The track will be open at 9:00 am. The course will be closed at 9:45 am for racing to start at 10:00am. The Southern Walnut Creek Trail, which can be accessed via Delwau Lane, is recommended for warm up. Please follow all rules of the road on Delwau Lane.

START TIMES

Racing will begin at 10:00 am. Start times will be posted Thursday, February 27, 2025 at 6pm to <https://www.laprimaveratx.com/schedule>. Participants will also be emailed start lists.

EQUIPMENT

ALLOWED EQUIPMENT

- Road bike with drop bars and both brake calipers functioning
- Aero rim carbon wheels (16 spoke minimum, spokes must be metal)
- Skinsuits
- Snell / ANSI approved aerodynamic helmets
- Shoe covers

DISALLOWED EQUIPMENT

- Time trial specific bicycles (example: Specialized Transition or Shiv, Trek Speed Concept, Cervelo P3, P4, Giant Trinity, et al)
- Disc wheels

- Clip on or "aero bars"
- "Aero" water bottles

RIDER POSITION

According to USAC rule 111(k) Rider Position. The rider shall normally assume a sitting position on the bicycle. This position requires that the only points of support are the following: the feet on the pedals, the hands on the handlebars and the seat on the saddle.

In chapter 3, Road Racing, the rider position rule is further emphasized in rule 3B11. Position on the bicycle. Riders must observe the standard position as defined by 111(k). Sitting on the bicycle's top tube is prohibited. Furthermore, using the forearms as a point of support on the handlebar is prohibited except in time trials.

DRAFTING

Drafting is not allowed, per USA Cycling Rule 3E6(b) - No rider shall take pace behind another rider closer than 25 meters (80 feet) ahead or 2 meters (7 feet) to the side.

COURSE

Riders will complete 3.75 laps of the Driveway Grand Prix Loop in a clockwise direction. Time will stop after the fourth time the rider crosses the finish line. No course cutting is allowed.

MECHANICALS/FLAT TIRES

If you have a flat in the TT you can either fix the flat yourself OR you can report to the officials. After verification by an official (blue shirt), the rider will be placed after the slowest racer in the same category and may start the road race stage.

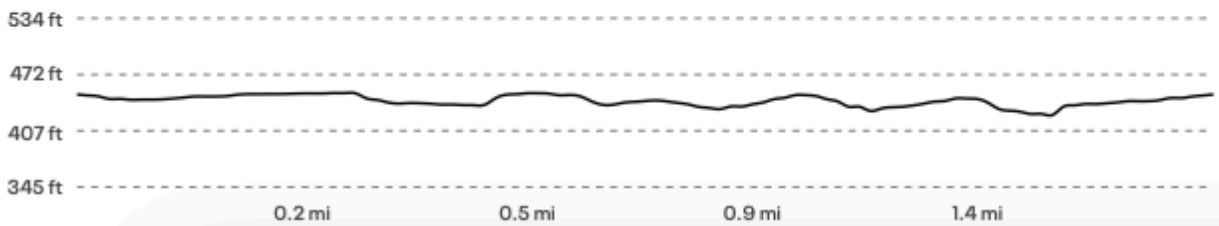

From IH-35 (North of Austin) go west on FM 1431, 21 miles to Lago Vista. Go left (south) on Lohman's Ford Road for 3 miles, then right on Boggy Ford for 2 miles, then left on American Drive to Start/Finish located at: 1925 American Dr. Lago Vista, TX 78645

PARKING

The ONLY designated parking area is south of Highland Lake Drive. Do NOT park on American Drive between Highland Lake Drive and Boggy Ford Road or you will be ticketed and towed. Please see the maps for designated parking locations.



COURSE DESCRIPTION

The road race course is a 5.5 mile course consisting of 2 right hand corners and 250 ft of climbing per lap. The course is open to traffic. Centerline rule is in effect. Be cautious at the corners. Course will be traversed clockwise.

VEHICLES ON COURSE

The course is open to traffic. All racers and groups of racers must NEUTRALIZE when approaching any vehicles especially medical vehicles on the course.

WHEEL SUPPORT

All support follow vehicles will be wheels in/wheels out. This means if you flat, you only get a wheel if you put one in. Vehicles may become neutral (meaning anyone can have a wheel) if there is a surplus of wheels. If you received a spare during the race you MUST return it immediately following the race.

- Wheel drop off - Take spare wheels to the support follow vehicles at least 30 minutes before your race with wheels tagged.
- Post race wheel pickup – Wheels will be returned to the start area. Please pickup your wheels immediately following your race. Do not expect them to be transported. *Violet Crown, The LeadOut Foundation, sponsors, officials and volunteers are not responsible for any equipment left at the race.*

RACE FINISH LINE

No centerline rule in effect for the final 400 meters.

FEED ZONE

The Chief Referee will determine if and when the feed zone is open.

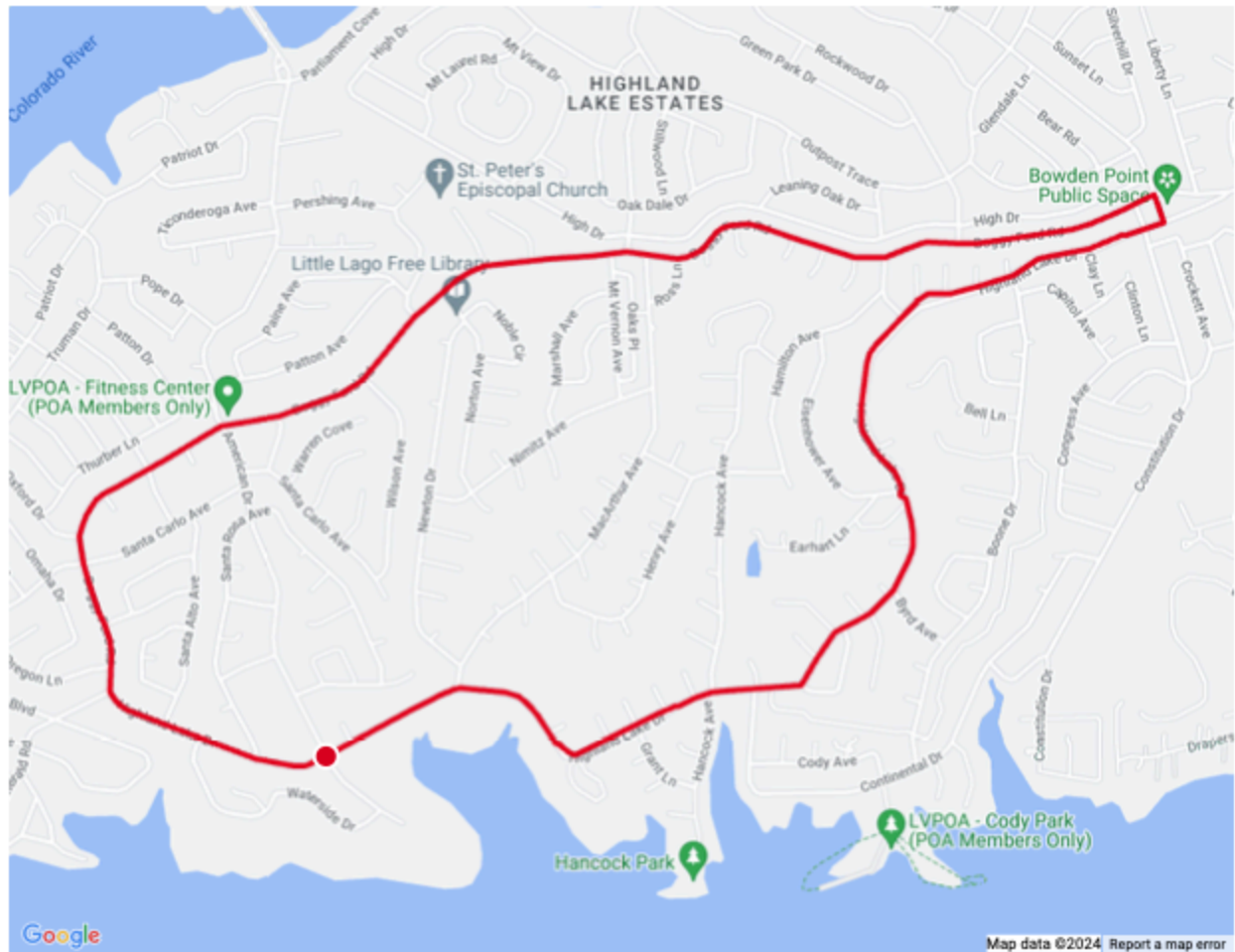

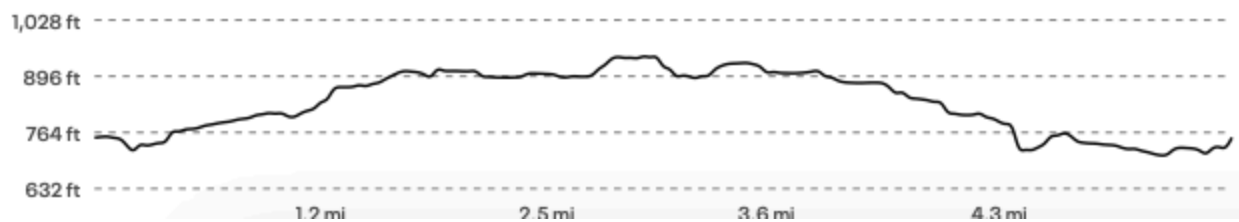

From IH-35 (North of Austin) go west on FM 1431, 21 miles to Lago Vista. Go left (south) on Lohman's Ford Road for 3 miles, then right on Boggy Ford for 2 miles, then left on American Drive to Start/Finish located at: 1925 American Dr. Lago Vista, TX 78645

PARKING

The ONLY designated parking area is south of Highland Lake Drive. Do NOT park on American Drive between Highland Lake Drive and Boggy Ford Road or you will be ticketed and towed. Please see the maps for designated parking locations.



COURSE DESCRIPTION

The road race course is a 5.5 mile course consisting of 2 left hand corners and 250 ft of climbing per lap. The course is open to traffic. Centerline rule is in effect. Be cautious at the corners. Course will be traversed counterclockwise.

VEHICLES ON COURSE

The course is open to traffic. All racers and groups of racers must NEUTRALIZE when approaching any vehicles especially medical vehicles on the course.

WHEEL SUPPORT

All support follow vehicles will be wheels in/wheels out. This means if you flat, you only get a wheel if you put one in. Vehicles may become neutral (meaning anyone can have a wheel) if there are surplus of wheels. If you received a spare during the race you MUST return it immediately following the race.

- Wheel drop off - Take spare wheels to the support follow vehicles at least 30 minutes before your race with wheels tagged.

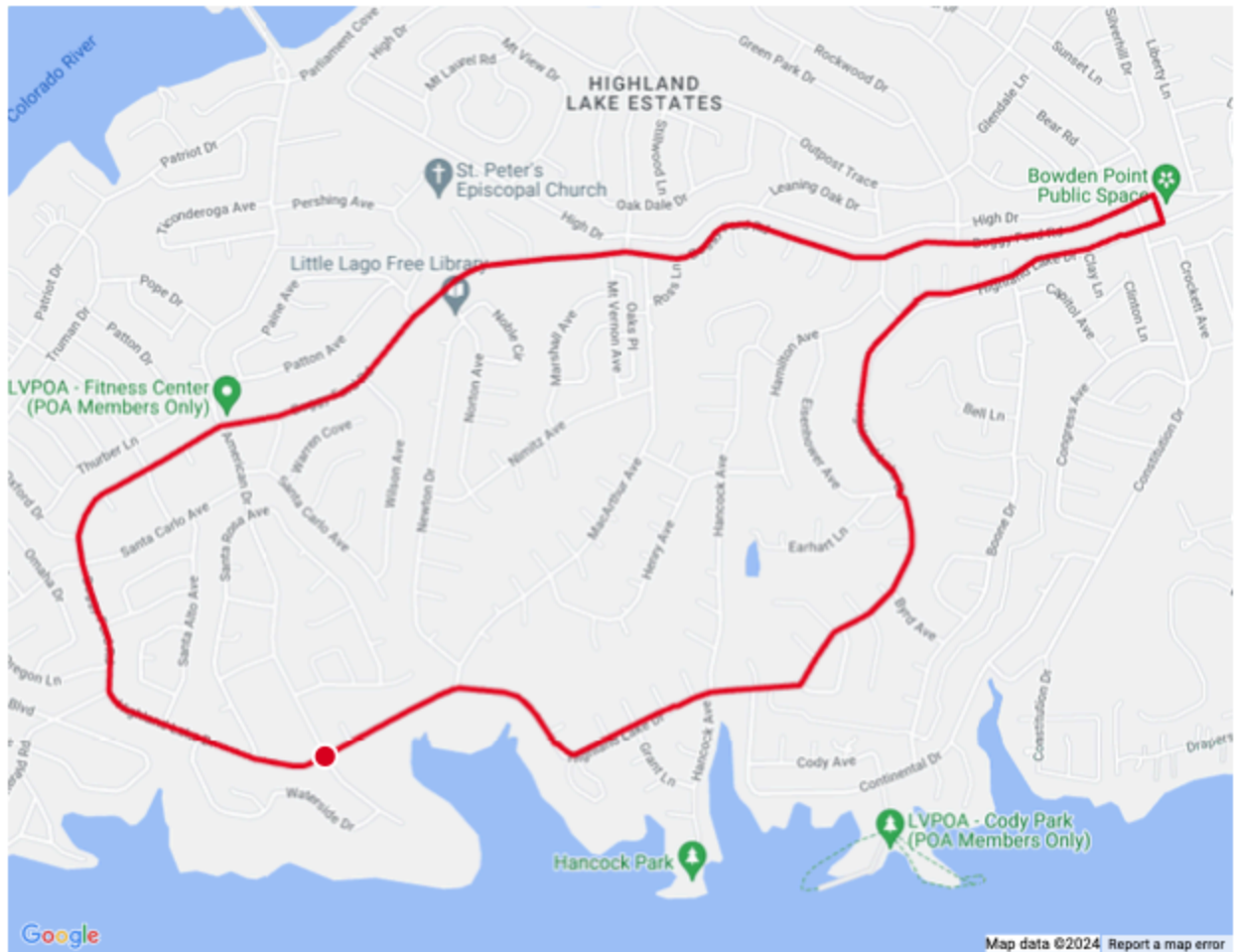
